Liverpool Women's Health Centre was established under a Federal Grant in 1975, by women from within the Women's Liberation Movement in close consultation with a group of women from Green Valley.

It was the second women's health centre to open in New South Wales, helping to pioneer new approaches to health care and service delivery based on feminist principles and philosophy.

Over the years the centre has participated in campaigns and actions for change aimed at improving the quality, range and accessibility of health services for women.

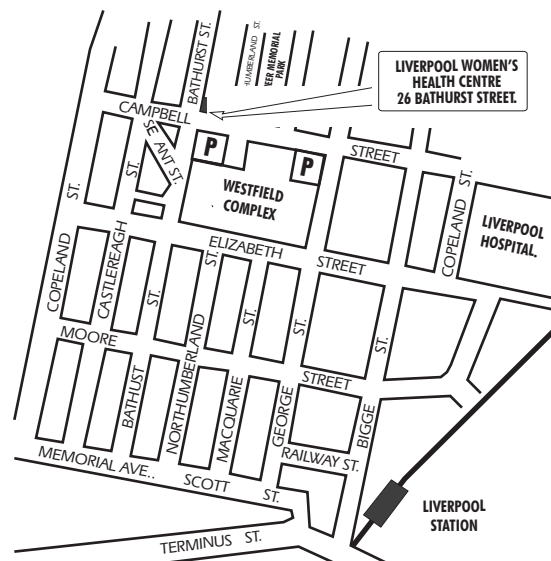
It has been instrumental in developing new services for women both in the local area and beyond. These include child care services, a refuge for single women, sexual assault services, and health services for Aboriginal Women.

- We believe every woman has the right to make her own informed decisions about her health and her life.
- A team of trained women who have a wide range of skills caters for your health care needs.
- Our staff come from a variety of cultural backgrounds. Some are bilingual and may be able to help if you have any difficulties with English.

Services We Offer...

- Individual medical consultations for contraception, pregnancy advice, Pap smears, breast checks, pre-menstrual tension, menopause, vaginal infections, STDs & HIV/AIDS etc.
- Naturopathic, acupuncture and therapeutic massage consultations.
- Individual counselling for emotional problems, relationships, sexual assault, domestic violence, grief and loss etc.
- Legal advice consultations.
- Court support for women experiencing domestic violence.
- Support services for migrant and Aboriginal women.
- Education and support groups for women's health issues are advertised in our quarterly calendar.
- Regular yoga, Tai Chi or meditation classes.
- Lesbian social group.
- Information, advice and referral.
- Aboriginal Women's Healing Space.
- WEEO WISER Young women's peer education project on healthy relationships.
- Health promotion activities.

We Will Also...

- Provide speakers for women's groups and other service providers.
- Arrange Pap smear clinics or health education sessions in your community or workplace.
- Assist community organisations to develop health programs for their client groups
- Train other workers in women's health and related issues.
- Make available our resources pamphlets, books, videos and audio tapes.

Costs...

- Medical consultations and pathology are bulk billed.
- There is a small fee for our naturopathic, acupuncture and massage services. As there is a high demand for these services, preference is given to women who cannot afford private fees.
- Other services are free, or invite a small donation.
- No woman will be turned away because she cannot afford to pay.
